## Three Issues Most Frequently Cited as Requiring More Attention from New York City Government

### Guide to the Responses

Top Issues	Responses Included
Infrastructure	Includes improvements to roads, bridges, public transportation, and facilities
Safety/crime	Includes people detailing issues related to safety (guns, gangs, etc.), crime, and safety services. Does NOT include mention of relationship with police department.
Housing	Includes affordable housing, landlord issues, issues with Section 8 vouchers and NY HUD offices, construction of new housing, and gentrification concerns.
Traffic/parking/mobility	Related specifically to issues of traffic, parking and parking tickets, pedestrian mobility, bicycle ease of travel, and overall ease of travel in the city.
Homelessness	Includes people wanting help and services for the homeless, as well as those calling for greater enforcement of anti-loitering provisions.
Schools/education	Includes improving schools, after school programs, and the education system in general, as well as educational facilities.
Cleanliness/appearance	Related to garbage, cleanliness of sidewalks, streets, parks, and in general, and building appearances.
Cost of living/affordability/income	Issues affording living in the city, including income, high taxes, public transportation fares, assistance programs, cost of food, and basic needs.
